#### WORKSHOP AIMS

- Acquire knowledge about coral reefs, the CoralWatch program, and sustainability.
- Gain field experience in the marine environment, including the use of tools and conducting surveys.
- Develop Ambassador ideas into actionable and pragmatic plans.
- Hone skills through opportunities such as reef walks, presentations, and displays.
- Foster a collaborative atmosphere by exchanging ideas, inspiring and supporting each other.
- Build meaningful connections with fellow participants.

#### WORKSHOP CONTENT

- Informative presentations (coral biology, CoralWatch monitoring, sustainability, data analysis).
- Interactive working sessions (roleplay, project development, science communication, planning, practice sessions, data entry).
- Fieldwork (snorkelling, collecting data, monitoring techniques).

#### YOUR CONTRIBUTION

- Active participation in CoralWatch community events (school visits, festivals, workshops).
- Collect and upload Coral Health Chart data and inspire others to do the same.
- Report and liaise on outreach activities and experiences to CoralWatch.

- Arrange and cover travel expenses from your location to Gladstone.

#### ELIGIBILITY

- Be a confident swimmer/snorkeller.
- Available to attend the full 5-day intensive training workshop at Heron Island Research Station from 24 28 February 2024.
- Available to attend the Ambassador return workshop at Moreton Bay Research Station on North Stradbroke Island in September 2024 (date TBC).
- Available in volunteer capacity in 2024, and beyond if you wish.



### **APPLY NOW**

Up to 15 participants will be selected through a formal application process. You can download the application form from CoralWatch and propose your Ambassador ideas to CoralWatch before 17 December 2023. (https://coralwatch.org/index.php/ambassadors/)

CoralWatch will deliver a 5-day workshop, including accommodation, food, materials, expertise and onward support with a certificate upon completion. Participants pay for their own transport to Gladstone and a workshop contribution fee of \$250 AUD.
